Indirect Contact with Personal Health Information

As of June 2019, [TCPS 2 \(2018\)](https://ethics.gc.ca/eng/policy-politique_tcps2-eptc2_2018.html) replaced TCPS 2 (2014) as the official research ethics policy of the federal research agencies (CIHR, NSERC, and SSHRC). The Secretariat is in the midst of developing a new CORE tutorial that will incorporate many of the changes found in the new Policy. A summary of the revisions that were published in TCPS (2018) is available at the same page. However, there were no fundamental changes to the Policy. The three core principles – Respect for Persons, Concern for Welfare, and Justice – continue to be the foundation of both the new Policy and CORE.
