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The **CaRMS Committee** is just one of the subcommittees of the pediatric residency program. It is chaired by Dr. Laura Vivian. Other members are Dr. Lynette Bowes, Dr. Mary Jane Smith, Dr. John Martin and the Chief Residents

The committee meets **four** times per year

Fall- to evaluate our questions and file review process for the upcoming CaRMS iteration, decide upon staff to ask for help with file evaluation and interviewing

Late Fall- to decide upon candidates to interview

Winter- to rank interview candidates

Spring- to evaluate how the CaRMS process went and decide upon any changes for the following year

Each person serves a three year term (other than the chief residents). The committee relies on staff and residents who volunteer each year to help review the 120-140 applications we receive and interview between 60-80 candidates.

The CaRMS selection process will be delayed this year due to COVID. File review will not take place until February 2021 and interviews will be in March 2021. All interviews will be conducted virtually as we did last year. Match day will be on April 20th, 2021.



Competence Corner

As the date for our switch to Competency By Design (July 2021) moves closer there are a few new ideas that we need to get used to.

Residents will no longer move through our program based on what year they are in, rather they will complete the 4 different stages of training:

- Stage 1: Transition to discipline
- Stage 2: Foundations of discipline
- Stage 3: Core of discipline
- Stage 4: Transition to practice

Movement from one stage to the next will depend on the resident completing the required EPA's for that stage, not the number of rotations they have completed.

An EPA is an entrustable professional activity. EPAs are authentic tasks of a discipline. What are some EPA's in pediatrics that you can think of?? I think of taking a very good history and physical tailored to pediatrics- so including the neonatal and pregnancy history. This would be one example of an EPA found in Stage 1.
