#### WHO WE ARE

Memorial University is the only university in the province of Newfoundland and Labrador. It began as a College in 1925 but acquired full status as a university in 1949. It has campuses in St. John's, Corner Brook and the United Kingdom with a current enrollment of over 18,000 full-time and part-time students.
