Message from the Chair

Hello Everyone,

A belated welcome to a new academic year! As a Discipline, we continue to be busy providing clinical care and medical education at the undergraduate, postgraduate and continuing professional development levels. In the undergraduate medical curriculum alone in 2023-2024, we will deliver 29 hours of lectures, 2 hours of tutorial, 15 hours of clinical skills, supervise 70 clinical clerks and take part in at least 7 OSCES. Thank you to all our faculty and residents for their ongoing engagement, and our amazing administrators, Lisa, Jackie and Melissa, for keeping it organized.

Given the academic demands on our group, I am very pleased to announce some new GFT positions for the Discipline. Dr. Anne Hurley and Dr. Christopher Earle were successfully recruited to the posts previously advertised. Moreover, we have been given direction to recruit another GFT in Geriatric Psychiatry, as Memorial University will be introducing a new postgraduate program in Geriatric Medicine, as well as expanding its Care of the Elderly Program in Family Medicine.

While we continue to use technology to facilitate our distributed education model and promote efficiency, there have been some lovely opportunities to come together in recent months. The retreat in September could have taken place with no content for the same amount of time as people caught up and reconnected. We were particularly delighted to see Dr. Edison, who made the trip in from Grand Falls. It is my hope to plan more hybrid Discipline activities moving forward.

In addition to socializing, we did use the retreat as an opportunity to discuss the upcoming introduction of legislation that will allow MAiD MD-SUMC: Medical assistance in dying where a mental disorder is the sole underlying medical condition, in March 2024. This is uncharted territory for the disciplines across the country, and can elicit strong feelings from patients, family members, advocates, and clinicians. It will be important that we continue such dialogue and support one another as we navigate this change in clinical and academic settings.

Another challenge in 2024 will be the "double cohort" eligibility for the Royal College examinations. With the introduction of Competence by Design, residents now complete the exam in PGY4, prior to commencing the Transition to Practice stage of training. This, of course, means that in 2024 we have 2 cohorts of residents preparing for these pivotal exams, while balancing clinical demands. I have great

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faith in the leadership of Dr. Latus and Dr. Mercer, as well as the residents and their unfailing support of one another, to meet this challenge. Moreover, I look forward to working with our current PGY4s next year as they truly assume a junior attending role after achieving this important milestone.

As 2023 comes to an end, the Faculty of Medicine's Strategic Plan is being reviewed. Most of the established working groups are completing their mandates, with the exception of the group focused on Equity, Diversity and Inclusion (EDI). This group for the Faculty of Medicine will be chaired by our own Dr. Elcock. EDI considerations are particularly critical in psychiatry, as our patients can experience the intersectionality of being in a marginalized group, and the stigma of psychiatric illness, while trying to access safe care. I have, therefore, initiated a resident-faculty working group within our own Discipline to enhance the educational program around EDI, and collaborate with Dr. Elcock's group.

I would be remiss not to remind everyone that November 2024 will also include our Royal College Accreditation review for General Psychiatry, Geriatric Psychiatry and Child and Adolescent Psychiatry. Our tireless Program Directors, Dr. Latus, Dr. Hickey, and Dr. Bonnell, steered us successfully through internal reviews with PGME in the last year. They will need our ongoing responsiveness to emails, updates, and meetings, so, thank you in advance for your time.

As 2023 comes to a close, I wish everyone a wonderful holiday with family and friends. I also hope that we return, invigorated, to meet the challenges and the possibilities of 2024.
