I'd like to thank everyone for their patience and support as I've started to figure out the many ways in which Dr. Noble kept things running so smoothly for so long. I'm particularly grateful for the assistance of our co-administrative residents Alain Bateman, Rebecca Harrison and Emily Fitzgerald, and our invaluable administrator, Jackie Doran.

It has been a typically eventful year. One highlight was that we were one of only a couple of programs in Canada to fill all our spots during the first round of the CARMS residency match. In July, we will welcome six new residents to our program, including our first ever resident for the Grand Falls-Windsor stream of our program. For the St. John's stream, we will be joined by Jamie Green, Elizabeth Rowe and Charity-Jean Drover from Memorial, along with Vincent Dupont from McGill and Tai-ta Chen from UBC. This 'double cohort' year will certainly pose challenges for our whole resident group. It will be important for the faculty to support our residents through this, as I'm sure we will.

Message from the Chair

Hello Everyone,

A belated welcome to the 2022-2023 academic year! It has been a year of transition and some delays, but the Discipline continues to thrive and move forward.

I would like to start by again recognizing the immense impact of Dr. Kim St. John, who stepped down as Chair in August 2022. Her contributions at the medical school, regional health authority and nationally at the Royal College were recognized by her promotion to Full Professor in the Faculty of Medicine. We have all been benefactors of her tremendous work ethic, experience and vision, but also individually from her time, patience and mentorship. I am aware that I have big shoes to fill!

At the undergraduate level, the medical school was granted full accreditation under the leadership of Dr. Taryn Hearn. This would of course not be possible without the continuous efforts of our faculty and residents who deliver lectures, tutorials, clinical skills, OSCE evaluations, multiple choice questions, clinical supervision, ITARS, mentorship and role modeling. There was a high degree of interest in Psychiatry this year from the Memorial's graduating class which I also think reflects our collective efforts, so thank you. At the postgraduate level, we have had another successful year. Dr. Andrew Latus assumed the role of Program Director and Dr. Robert Mercer of Associate Program Director in July 2022. The Competence Committee continues to refine and improve our CBD (Competence by Design) process and evaluations. We welcome Dr. Hickey back to her role as Chair of that committee and thank Dr. Anne Hurley for her work during Dr. Hickey's sabbatical. The program did well in the PGME-led internal review, our PGY5 residents passed their Royal College written examinations prior to the OSCE, and we filled our CaRMS spots in the first match. These are all excellent markers of success and reflect the Discipline's overall excellence.

The next 2-3 years will be an exciting and challenging time for our Discipline. 2024 will be psychiatry's "double cohort" year when PGY5 residents in the traditional stream and PGY4 CBD residents will both be eligible for the Royal College examination. 2024 will also be Memorial's Royal College PGME accreditation, which will include our General Psychiatry, Child Psychiatry and Geriatric Psychiatry programs. Finally, we take occupancy of NAHHAF and the renovated Psychiatric Assessment Unit (PAU) space in early 2025. While there are many advantages to this move, there are understandable concerns about a decrease in bed numbers. It will be important to maintain our communication and support of one another during these transitions, but I have every confidence in our group to navigate the challenges and to maximize the opportunities.
