Cultural Psychiatry Day 2019- Indigenous Mental Health: Clinical Wisdom and Applications

Cultural Psychiatry Day 2019 was held on Wednesday, May 1, from 3-6 PM. Cultural Psychiatry Day is a national presentation anchored at University of Toronto designed to increase exposure to topic in Cultural Psychiatry. It is planned by a committee consisting of the Departments of Psychiatry across the country, Dr. Robert Mercer and Dr. Melanie Wong represented Memorial. This year's topic was Indigenous Mental Health: Clinical Wisdom and Applications. The workshop featured Dr. Nel Wieman who is the Senior Medical Officer for the First Nations Health Authority in BC. Dr. Wieman shared her experiences as an Indigenous woman, and how it has impacted her Psychiatric practice and her life in general. Mr. Bill Hill, an Indigenous Knowledge Keeper and Social Worker, along with Dr. Arlene MacDougall also spoke of their experience working with the Indigenous population and their work in pioneering a new mental health clinic in London. Finally, there was also an interesting presentation from Dr. Ashley Johnson, a PGY5 Psychiatry resident who is also Indigenous. She shared her experience as an Indigenous woman and shared some resources that may be helpful for those working with Indigenous mental health. Overall, much positive feedback was received and the day was well attended.

We would like to thank Dr. Melanie Wong for her participation over the last 3 years, and welcome Dr. Jordan Power who will be taking over as Resident representative.


