General Knowledge

Residents will be familiar with the following:

Anatomy

- 1. Abdominal cavity, including viscera and anatomic space.
- 2. GI tract

Pathophysiology

- 1. Appendicitis
- 2. Complicated biliary tract disease
- 3. Complicated peptic ulcer disease
- 4. Diverticulitis, simple and complicated
- 5. GI bleeding
- 6. Large bowel obstruction
- 7. Pancreatitis
- 8. Perianal disease: acute presentation (abscess, thrombosed hemorrhoid)
- 9. Principles of ATLS
- 10. Small bowel obstruction
- 11. Soft tissue infection

General Skills (PGY 1 and 2)

Residents should:

- 1. Start resuscitation as appropriate.
- 2. Obtain relevant history.
- 3. Perform physical examination.
- 4. Order and interpret lab work.

- 5. Order relevant X-rays.
- 6. Compile a differential diagnosis.
- 7. Suggest a management plan.
- 8. Collaborate with a senior person to make an operative plan as appropriate.
- 9. Participate in trauma code, with senior person. (Emergency physician until chief resident or surgeon arrives).

General Skills (PGY 1 and 2):

Residents will be able to perform:

- 1. Know the indications for operative intervention.
- 2. Know the indications for interventional or percutaneous approaches to treatment.
- 3. Know the indications for a non-operative approach.
- 4. Have a full understanding of the operative approach.
- 5. Be able to identify failure of non-operative management.
- 6. Obtain ATLS certification.

Technical Skills (PGY 1 and 2)

Residents will be able to perform:

- 1. Chest tube insertion
- 2. Incision and drainage of perianal abscess
- 3. Open and closure of abdomen, both laparoscopic and open
- 4. Uncomplicated appendectomy, both laparoscopic and open
- 5. Uncomplicated laparoscopic cholecystectomy

Technical Skills (PGY 3 and 4)

The resident will be able to perform:

- 1. Laparotomy for bowel obstruction.
- 2. Trauma laparotomy and associated procedures.
- 3. Laparotomy for perforated diverticulitis, including Hartmann's procedure (with assistance).
- 4. Groin exploration for incarcerated/strangulated hernia (with assistance).
- 5. Bowel resection, both large and small (with assistance).

- 6. Laparotomy for complicated peptic ulcer disease.
- 7. Laparoscopic appendectomy for complicated disease.
- 8. Laparoscopic cholecystectomy for complicated disease.

Collaborator

General Requirements(PGY 1 and 2)

The resident will be able to:

- 1. Interact with other health care professionals as appropriate when managing an acute care surgery issue. (eg calling OR to book a case).
- 2. Consult effectively with other physicians.
- 3. Develop a care plan for the patient.

Communicator

General Requirements (PGY 1 and 2)

The resident will be able to:

- 1. Gather information on the patient that is complete and takes in to account cultural and social aspects that may affect the patient's perioperative care.
- 2. Ensure that information given to the patient and their family is consistent across the team.
- 3. Effectively and accurately convey information.
- 4. Complete written consultations and operative notes that are accurate, legible and timely.
- 5. Handle conflict.

General Requirements (PGY 3 and 4)

The resident will be able to:

- 1. Establish a good relationship with the more junior house staff.
- 2. Effectively provide and receive information.
- 3. Prepare documentation that is accurate and timely, and help junior house staff do the same.
- 4. Handle conflict.

Health Advocate

- 1. Identify social issues that may affect the patients' length of stay.
- 2. Utilize information gathered to prioritize patients for access to the X-ray department or the operating room.

Professional

- 1. Take responsibility for the overall care of the surgical patient, in collaboration with the rest of the team.
- 2. Demonstrate appropriate personal and interpersonal behavior; e.g. explain management plan to the patient and their family, discuss results with family, the patient and the team.

General Requirements(PGY 3 and 4)

The resident will be able to:

- 1. Take responsibility for the overall care of the surgical patient, in collaboration with the rest of the team, taking charge of the care.
- 2. Demonstrate appropriate personal and interpersonal behaviour for example, review management of the patient's care with other team members, in a non-threatening constructive manner.
