

ROBERT CREWS

DARTMOUTH DEVONSHIRE

- 1673 Robert, son of Richard, baptised at Dartmouth(Townstall)
- 1760 Robert, son of Richard, baptised at Dartmouth (St. Saviours)
- 1762 Robert buried at Dartmouth St. Saviours, July.

WOOLBOROUGH, DEVONSHIRE(now NEWTON ABBOTT)

- 1665/6 Robert married Jane Hayward
- 1707 Robert son of Jeremy baptised
- 1711 Robert son of Jeremy buried
- 1711 Robert son of Jeremy baptised
- 1789 Robert died age 77
- 1791 Robert son of John and Frances baptised

ISLINGTON DEVONSHIRE

- 1565/7 Robert son of John and Joane baptised

OF NEWFOUNDLAND

- 1781 Robert married Elizabeth Coady (Anglican)
- ca. 1815 Robert of Buckhorn Weston(Dorset England)came to Nfld.
- 1824 He and Mary (place/date of marriage unknown) had a son James baptised at Bonavista Methodist Chruch. They were residents of Bird Island Cove.
- 1825 They had another son George.

CAPTAIN ROBERT CRUSE (also spelled CROUSE, CROW)

- 1784 In October commander of the Robert of Greenock(Scotland), a vessel of 90 tons with an 8 man crew, voyage from St. John's, Nfld. to the Mediterranean with fish.
- 1786 Commander of the Swallow 120 tons, 11 men of Greenock, vessel owned by William Morrison. 12 March sailed from Clyde to Newfoundland, from St. John's, sailed to Quebec. 9 July sailed form Quebec to Newfoundland with provisions. October news of her arrival at Oporto(Portugal) from Newfoundland with fish.
- 1787 On her voyage from Oporto to Britain with a cargo of fruit and wine, the vessel was lost, crew saved.
- 1787 Appointed to command the Venus of Greenock, a brig of 50 tons and 8 men owned by Messrs Hunter and Company. 1 April sailed from Clyde to Newfoundland.
- 1788 26 March sailed from Clyde to Newfoundland.
- 1790 The vessel now re-rigged as a Schooner.
12 April sailed form Clyde to Newfoundland. In Newfoundland Crouse left the vessel to take command of another of Hunter's vessels the Betsey a brig of 126 tons and 11 men. September arrived Clyde from Newfoundland on the 16th. From thence (despite the lateness of the season) she made another voyage to Newfoundland.
1 February arrived Clyde from Newfoundland.
4 March sailed from Clyde to Cadiz(Spain)
From thence took a cargo of salt to Newfoundland
August news of her arrival at Lisbon from Newfoundland with fish.
16 December arrived Clyde from Newfoundland.
