Dear Mrs. Brook,

Thank you for your letter of March 25th, 1982 regarding the Perriman family.

I think it is worth mentioning that there were Perrimans intermittently engaged in the Newfoundland trade for three centuries. As early as 1675 Thomas and George Perriman operated spparate fishing establishments (plantations) at Trepassey, Newfoundland. Both were family men - Thomas with wife and four children and George, a widower, with three sons. Throughout the 18th century there were many Perrimans, captains and mates, sailing out of the Westcountry ports of Teignmouth, Plymouth, Dartmouth, Exeter and Poole. Bloyd's Registers contain surnames of Captains but, unfortunately, no christian names. We know, however, that in the 1720's a George Perriman was captain of the "Mary" and engaged in the Newfoundland Trade. Also a captain Thomas Perriman was engaged in the Westcountry- Newfoundland carrying trade during the 1736-41 period.

Closer to the period in which you are interested:

(1785-86) Captain Thomas Perriman of the "Industry" carried salt-cod to Europe; travelled between Barbados and Newfoundland with rum and sugar.

(1811-18) Captain Thomas Perriman made seasonal trips to and from Newfoundland on the "Eliza", "Minerva" and "Venus."

This entry above (1811-18) almost assuredly refers to your great great Grandfather, Thoas Perriman. It would have placed him in St. John's in the proper time period to have met and married Elizabeth and to have had two sons born there (1819-and 1821) by my calculations of your Teignmouth Census records. The family would have then moved to Teignmouth sometime after 1821 in time for Mary to be born there (1823).

We have a reference to a Thomas of West Teignmouth dying in 1821 at age 52. He was probably the husband of Grace Perriman and the couple had a son, also named George, in 1805. He may have been a cousin or other relative of your Thomas Sr., and Jr. Our records show a George, (1833) an English coastal schooner captain operating out of Dartmouth for Davey and Co. He is obviously not your great grandfather's brother. In addition, a captain George Perriman sailed our of Plymouth, Exeter and Liverpool during the 1817-42 period on the "Betsey," the "Liberty" and the "New Ann". He could well have been a relative of Thomas Sr., even possibly a brother. It would seem that Thomas and George were popular christian names with the Perriman's. In your further research you are likely to find these names appearing with fascinating (and sometimes frustrating) regularity.
