I have the honor to inform your Excellency  
lest an Official Communication should not reach  
you by the present conveyance, from the Secretary  
of State that His Royal Highness the Prince  
Regent has pleased to transfer the services of  
F Colclough Esquire Chief Justice of Prince  
Edwards Island to Newfoundland and those of Mr.  
Thomas Tremlett from Newfoundland to Prince  
Edwards Island, whose Commissions are in my  
possession and as the Public Service in Newfoundland  
peculiarly requires that Mr Tremlett should  
not quit that Island before the arrival of his  
Successor Mr Colclough which also appears to have  
been the sentiment of Lord Bathurst by his having  
apprized Mr Colclough that his Commission would be  
found in my possession at St John's I therefore  
request your Excellency will please to obviate  
any impediments that you may be able to the  
immediate removal of Mr Colclough to St John's,  
who it is my intention to afford as early and  
conveyances circumstances will permit me to do.
