The School of Music seeks to fill a renewable eight-month teaching-term appointment in Low Brass at the rank of Lecturer or Teaching Assistant Professor, starting September 2021. Duties will include applied instruction in trombone, euphonium, and tuba at the undergraduate and graduate levels. The successful candidate will also be expected to teach in at least one secondary area in keeping with the expertise of the successful candidate.

Memorial University is home to Atlantic Canada's largest and most comprehensive school of music. At the undergraduate level the School offers Bachelor of Music programs in performance, musicologies, composition and music education (conjoint B.Mus./B.Mus.Ed.) to 150 students. At the graduate level the School offers M.Mus. programs (performance, performance/pedagogy and conducting) and M.A./Ph.D. programs in ethnomusicology to more than 50 students from across the globe. The School's faculty of 25 performers and scholars enjoy international reputations in their fields and are active partners across the province's vibrant musical, artistic and cultural communities. Qualifications for the position include a doctorate in a relevant area (completed or ABD) or its equivalent in professional experience at national or international levels, demonstrated excellence as a performer on trombone, euphonium, or tuba, and a record of successful teaching. Salary for this position is dependent on qualifications and experience in accordance with the terms of the Collective Agreement.
