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Pilot project

 Focusing on 5 communities and their catchment areas in Eastern NL, Avalon Peninsula, and Burin Peninsula (St. John's, Bonavista, Carbonear, Clarenville, and Marystown).

Long-term goal

 To inform the development of resources and best strategies to support a sustainable action plan to enhance access to and uptake of supportive services for seniors and their partners/significant others living at home with dementia in NL.

Objectives

- To identify formal supportive services for seniors with early dementia and their caregivers/partners/significant others.
- To identify barriers and facilitators related to access and uptake of formal supportive services that are necessary to improve and sustain health and QOL.
- To identify best strategies to support the development, implementation, and sustainability of an action plan to enhance access and uptake of supportive services to improve health and QOL.
- To develop a toolkit of resources to facilitate awareness of and access to appropriate community supportive services for seniors living with early dementia and their caregivers.

Three phases

- 1. Identification of existing community supportive services for seniors with early dementia in NL.
- 1. Focus groups and individual interviews with descriptive thematic analysis.
- 1. Knowledge Translation and Dissemination
