# **Getting the Word Out:**

## Disseminating two new 'Evidence in Context' Reports



Community-Based Service Models for Seniors: On January 6, 2014, we will host a discussion of findings from our report on models of health care and social care that will enable seniors in our province to age in place. The full report, together with a four-page summary and a one-page brief, is available on the NLCAHR website: http://www.nlcahr.mun.ca/CHRSP/CSMS.php. To participate in the dissemination, RSVP to Rochelle.baker@med.mun.ca. Later in January, a CIHR Best Brains Exchange, facilitated by NLCAHR and hosted by the Department of Health and Community Services, will bring national experts to the province for a one-day, in-camera meeting with senior health system decision makers to review the best research evidence available to guide decisions about community-based care for seniors in Newfoundland and Labrador.

## **CHRSP PROJECTS FOR 2014**

In consultation with the province's four Regional Health Authorities and the Department of Health and Community Services, NLCAHR is developing a new round of topics for study under the Contextualized Health Research Synthesis Program (CHRSP) for 2014-2015. After a general call for topics, our filtering and voting process will yield a priority list of new topics identified by the leaders of the provincial health system. As we proceed to study these new topics, we will continue to work with our health system partners on team-building and consultation to optimize integrated knowledge translation and evidence-informed decision making in Newfoundland and Labrador.

In the meantime, CHRSP Project teams will complete the following reports in early 2014:

- An Evidence in Context study on Falls Prevention in Acute Care and Long-Term Care Settings: "What interventions are most effective in preventing falls in acute and long term care settings?"
- An Evidence in Context study on Point -of-Care Testing: "How effective and efficient is point-of-care testing compared to traditional sampling in the ER?"
- A Rapid Evidence Report on Ambulatory Care Services for Patients with Chronic Heart Failure

Other topics slated to commence in the new year include a *Rapid Evidence Report* on short-term health promotion strategies, and two *Evidence in Context Reports*: "Diabetes Prevention Strategies" and "Managing Aggression in Patients with Dementia."

We thank the five Health System Leaders and our CHRSP Champions for their vital contribution to our topic selection process and we look forward to working with them on these and other topics identified for study in the new year. Stay tuned for an announcement about these new studies.
