## **Memorial University School of Pharmacy**

Information regarding Practice Experiences for the Entry-to-Practice Pharm. D. (EPPD) Program for 2024-2025.

a. Class of 2025, entering their fifth and final year of studies, will be completing Advanced Pharmacy
 Practice Experiences (APPEs). The APPEs are comprised of four practice experience courses totaling 30
 weeks of advanced experiential learning, taking place from May 2024 through to April 2025.

\*Students will be assigned to sites and preceptors for all four APPE courses in January/February 2024.

Therefore, pharmacies are asked to respond to the Call for Preceptors with availability through to April 2025.

## The APPE courses are:

- PHAR 605P: Patient Care is an 8-week practice experience in any pharmacy setting where pharmacist care is provided to patients.
- PHAR 606P: Acute Care Hospital is an 8-week practice experience in an acute care hospital setting, where students will become an integral member of the patient care team.
- PHAR 607P: Community Pharmacy is an 8-week practice experience in a community pharmacy setting, where students will provide patient care by applying expanded scope of practice skills.
- **PHAR 608P: Elective** is a **6-week** experience which may occur in either a direct or non-direct patient care setting (e.g., research, education, advocacy, administration).

APPEs will take place in the following time blocks and are not required to be completed in sequential order.

- **b.** Prior to the APPE courses, during Winter Semester of Year 4, students complete **Phar 508P PPEIV,** a **2-week** placement in a **hospital patient care** setting which serves as a **transition** to advanced practice.
- 2. Class of 2026, students in the 3<sup>rd</sup> year of the EPPD Program will be completing two rotations:
  - **a. Phar 406P PPE II**: Consists of a **2- week** assigned placement in a **hospital dispensary**, where students will be introduced to the operations of a hospital pharmacy.
  - **b.** Phar 407P PPE III: Consists of a 4-week placement in any direct patient care pharmacy setting (e.g., community, hospital, clinic), the focus of which is to further develop the students' patient care skills.
    - Phar 407P is a student self-selected placement and students will be contacting sites directly to apply for placement. The School will maintain a list of sites that are willing to participate in the Phar 407P course through our regular "Call for Preceptors"; however this will not be a comprehensive list and additional practice sites may be approached by students seeking placement.
    - For Phar 407P only, students may apply pharmacy work experience completed during the course registration period towards meeting the requirements of the course.
- **3.** Class of 2027, students in the 2<sup>nd</sup> year of the EPPD Program, will be completing **Phar 305P PPE I,** a **6-week** placement in community pharmacy. Students will be assigned to sites and preceptors by the School, according to the usual process.
