The School of Pharmacy's new entry-to-practice Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) program will accept first admission in Fall 2017. The degree is comprised of five years in the Pharmacy program in addition to 30 credit hours of specific prerequisite courses. The PharmD will replace the current Bachelor of Science (Pharmacy) program.

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GUIDING PRINCIPLES

The entry-to-practice PharmD program will deliver:

3. Scientific inquisitors, critical thinkers, inter-professional collaborators, and independent decision makers with superb problem solving and communication skills.
4. Leaders and innovators, with the ability to adapt their practice to fulfill evolving professional roles.
5. Practice-ready pharmacists who are prepared to embrace the full and expanding scope of pharmacy practice.
6. Exemplary pharmacists who provide high quality, collaborative, patient-centred care with a focus on improving the health and well being of the citizens of Newfoundland and Labrador and beyond.
