QUALIFICATIONS: A M.A. in Philosophy is required with demonstrable extensive study at the graduate level of philosophy. Proven teaching ability at post-secondary level is required. Recent experience with distance delivery is preferred.

Along with the application form, applicants not on the Philosophy seniority list are asked to provide a copy of their C.V. and the names of two references.

All positions are subject to budgetary approval.
