This research is designed with specific academic and industry goals and aims to improve process efficiencies while supporting the development of products that best respond to trends in the context of a post COVID-19 globalized market.

The intern will be primarily based within the procurement department of CBPPL. The intern will have the opportunity to work closely with procurement managers in a real-world setting. This also means that they will be central in solving a complex issue that requires using qualitative and quantitative data and information from a variety of sources, which is generally the nature of many managerial roles. Therefore, this project will be an excellent way to further develop these analytical skills. The intern should also be aiming to advance their career through peer-reviewed publishing. This role should allow them to collect some insightful data and contribute to the discipline of management science.

Data collection for this project will include interviews, document and data analysis, and observation. Deliverables for this project include: 1) a report and presentation to summarize the research and managerial recommendations for CBPPL; 2) a presentation at an academic conference to help develop an academic publication; 3) two peer-reviewed academic publications.
