Applications are invited from qualified individuals who are interested in being considered for a position as a per course instructor teaching Psychology 3900 Design and Analysis III in Fall semester 2019 on the St. John's campus. The course is scheduled for *T R 09.00-10.15*, and the labs are *W 15.00-17.50* and *18.00-20.50* although this may change. The Calendar description is:

**3900 Design and Analysis III** is a course on complex and specialized research design in Psychology. Multifactor research designs that employ both between- and within-subjects independent variables. Advantages and disadvantages of using multifactor research designs to test psychological hypotheses. Hierarchical designs and incomplete factorials. The use of covariates and blocking to increase experimental precision. Problems created by missing data. Single subject designs. How to answer specific psychological questions in the context of complex designs. The design and analysis of non-experimental psychological research. Applications of such techniques as the analysis of variance and multiple linear regression to the data obtained with these research designs, with special attention to problems inherent in psychological research.

<u>Required qualifications</u>: (1) A demonstrated knowledge of psychology and of the specific topics noted in the course description; (2) an M.Sc. in psychology; and (3) demonstrated experience conducting research and publishing in peer-reviewed psychology journals are required. Preference will be given first to applicants who have previously taught Psychology 3900 on the St. John's campus, and secondarily to applicants who have previous experience teaching the equivalent of Psychology 3900 elsewhere.
