Applications are invited from qualified individuals who are interested in being considered for a position as a per course instructor teaching Psychology 7022 *Practicum in Child Assessment and Diagnosis* in Spring semester 2022 on the St. John's campus. Psychology 7022 Practicum in Child Assessment and Diagnosis provides an opportunity for students to complete a psychological assessment of a child. Students will administer a selected battery of psychometric tests and interviews, interpret the results, provide verbal feedback and write an integrative report of their findings and recommendations. Where possible they will also participate in a case conference or school meeting. The practicum requires that students spend 16 hours per week for 6 weeks working under supervision in the Psychology Clinic and attend a weekly seminar. The course is part of the doctoral program in clinical psychology and the instructor will be responsible for teaching students how to administer, score, and interpret a selected battery of psychometric tests and interviews at the MUN Psychology Clinic. Students will also learn how to write an integrative report of their findings for a child assessment. Where possible students will also participate in providing verbal feedback, a case conference and/or a school meeting.

Required qualifications: (1) A doctorate from a CPA- or APA-accredited clinical psychology program OR a Psy.D. from Memorial's clinical psychology program, (2) successful completion of a CPA- or APA-accredited pre-doctoral internship in clinical psychology, (3) either registered or eligible for Registration with the Newfoundland and Labrador Psychology Board, (4) demonstrated knowledge of the specific topics noted in the course description above, including proficiency in the administration and scoring of the WISC-V and WIAT-III, and (5) documented extensive clinical experience working with children and families.
