Applications are invited from qualified individuals who are interested in being considered for a position as a per course instructor teaching Psychology 6611 *Ethics of Professional Practice* in Winter semester 2019 on the St. John's campus. The course meeting time is still to be scheduled.

The course examines professional psychology ethics from a theoretical, professional, legal and regulatory perspective. The focus is a detailed review of current Canadian ethical codes and practice guidelines for providers of psychological services. Students analyze scenarios that illustrate ethical issues in clinical practice and research.

Required qualifications: (1) A doctorate from a CPA- or APA-accredited clinical psychology program OR a Psy.D. from Memorial's clinical psychology program, (2) successful completion of a CPA- or APA-accredited pre-doctoral internship in clinical psychology, (3) either registered or eligible for Registration with the Newfoundland and Labrador Psychology Board, (4) demonstrated knowledge of the specific topics noted in the course description above, including proficiency in the administration and scoring of the WISC-V and WIAT-III, and (5) documented extensive clinical experience working with children and families.
