

Research Mobilization Fellowship Program

Thanks to a generous grant from the Government of Newfoundland & Labrador, we are pleased to announce 17 fellowships of \$15,000 each for international graduate students to participate in the Research Mobilization Program. This unique program aims to bridge the gap between academic research and research commercialization, empowering students to translate their science and engineering research into commercially viable outcomes.

Program Eligibility

1. **International graduate students** enrolled in a research-based program at Memorial University. Please note that Postdoctoral Fellows are ineligible to apply.
2. Applicants must bring a project that aligns with **science and technology disciplines** and has potential for commercialization.
3. Students must be able to complete the **New Venture Creation** graduate course offered on Fridays, October to December, from 1:00 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. in the Faculty of Business Administration building, St. John's campus, room BN-4031 (for Grenfell and Labrador Campus students, an online option is available).
4. Students must be able to dedicate at least 5 hours per week to other program activities in addition to the course requirements, including but not limited to workshops on translational R&D, IP management, professionalism, and entrepreneurial thinking and mindset.
5. Participants must be present in St. John's for the duration of the program; exceptions will only be made for participants located in-person on the Grenfell or Labrador campuses.

Program Parameters

1. Program Duration: October 10th, 2025 – May 31st, 2026. Students must have availability on Fridays from 1:00 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. to participate in in-person sessions (online option available for Grenfell and Labrador campus students).
2. The Research Mobilization Fellowship Program is designed to:
 - i. Prepare participants for successful careers as scientist/engineer-entrepreneurs or professionals in academia, industry, or government.
 - ii. Equip students with interdisciplinary skills in technology innovation and entrepreneurship.
 - iii. Foster an entrepreneurial mindset and essential professional competencies.
 - iv. As a result of these learnings, students may determine that the project they are working on has potential for further development or commercialization beyond the scope of the program.

How to Apply:

1. Complete **all components** of this application form. Incomplete submissions will not be considered.
2. Review the full application and contents with your supervisor and have them sign at the bottom.
3. Email the completed and signed application package to rio@mun.ca and **copy your supervisor's @mun.ca email address on the submission. Applications without a supervisor copied will not be accepted.**

Please note the following:

1. Deadline for submission of complete applications is **Monday, September 15th, 2025, at 3 p.m.** The application **deadline is firm**. Submissions received after the stated deadline will not be reviewed or considered under any circumstances.
2. A confirmation of application receipt will be issued within 72 business hours. Please note that all application components are mandatory. Incomplete submissions will not be reviewed, and applicants will not be contacted to provide missing information. Ensure your application is complete and accurate prior to submission.
3. As part of the application process, students must ensure that their proposed project has been reviewed and approved by their supervisor prior to submission. This includes confirming that:
 - i. The supervisor supports the project's scope and relevance.
 - ii. The project does not violate any confidentiality or disclosure provisions outlined in existing research agreements.
4. Applications will be evaluated based on:
 - i. The relevance and commercialization potential of the research project.
 - ii. Alignment of the applicant's goals with the program objectives.
 - iii. Academic achievements, leadership and professional experiences.
5. Applications will be evaluated by a committee. Upon completion of the evaluation, successful applicants will be contacted first. RIO will confirm their participation in the program before notifying those who were not selected.
