

# Application for Pro Vice-Chancellor's Prize

## PRO VICE-CHANCELLOR'S PRIZE FOR UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS

### WINTER COMPETITION

Deadline for submissions for **Winter 2023 competition** is **Friday, April 21, 2023**.

Submissions for the Winter 2023 competition will have been completed during the Winter 2023 semester. Up to three prizes may be awarded and the amount of the prize is \$750 if the student wishes to take the prize right away or \$1,500 if a student wishes to continue to graduate studies at Memorial.

Instructors are invited to nominate outstanding undergraduate research essays or video/poster presentations completed in their courses. The student will need an instructor's signature to certify that the work is the student's own. Students should make a submission for work completed in Winter 2023.

All submissions must:

- Be easily understood by the committee members (i.e. should not be technical jargon-loaded submissions)
- Be that of a single author (student), and only one essay (video, poster) can be submitted for an individual student
- Be research-based for research papers (i.e. must contain citations from the relevant literature in a manner appropriate to a research essay in the discipline)
- Be submitted in partial fulfillment of course requirements (i.e. exclusive of theses/honours essays or 4950 Projects at Grenfell Campus)
- Work term reports will not be considered
- Submit a picture of the poster/creative piece of work or submit a video to [scholarships@mun.ca](mailto:scholarships@mun.ca)

Both the student and the instructor will certify that the work is the student's own by signing the declaration overleaf. In the case of work submitted directly by a student, the student will sign the declaration attached, and have it signed by an instructor who can vouch for the originality of the piece. The student will then submit the essay directly to the address below.

Student names and numbers will be removed from all entries prior to adjudication. The committee will adjudicate the entries for originality, cogency, lucidity, and, as relevant, fidelity to principles and conventions of academic inquiry.
