**Of the two nominations received to fill the two vacancies on the University Planning and Budget Committee, one member has served six consecutive years. Because of this individual's dedicated past service and future commitment to the Planning and Budget Committee, Senate agreed to approve a recommendation from the Committee on Committees for a waiver of regulations in respect to Dr. Robert Adamec as per Clause VI.C.3.(b) of the Senate Handbook of By-Laws and Procedures which reads:

"With the exception of those committee members serving on a committee by virtue of their office, no academic staff member shall serve more than six consecutive years on any one Senate standing committee."

Mr. Collins noted that the Committee will make another attempt to encourage members of faculty to volunteer for committees where vacancies exist and he urged members of Senate to do the same.

96.2 Membership of the ad hoc Committee to Conduct a Review of Undergraduate Appeals Procedures

At a meeting held on February 14, 2006, Senate approved the membership and terms of reference for the ad hoc Committee to Conduct a Review of the Undergraduate Appeals Procedures. At that time, the undergraduate student representative had not been determined. The Memorial University of Newfoundland Students' Union is now recommending that Ms. Sara Stoodley be the MUNSU representative.

The motion to appoint Ms. Sara Stoodley to the ad hoc Committee to Conduct a Review of Undergraduate Appeals Procedures which was moved by Mr. Collins, seconded by Mr. Andrews, carried.

96.3 <u>Motion concerning Membership on the Senate Committee on Undergraduate</u> Studies

A memo dated March 24, 2006 was received from the Committee on Committees advising that at a meeting held on March 22, 2006, the Committee considered a letter dated February 10, 2006 from the Sir Wilfred Grenfell College Academic Council which recommended the following:

"The Academic Council of Sir Wilfred Grenfell College respectfully requests of the Senate of Memorial University that the composition of the Senate Committee on Undergraduate Studies be expanded to include the Registrar of Sir Wilfred Grenfell College or delegate as ex-officio member."

The Committee on Committees, with the support of the Senate Committee on Undergraduate Studies, endorsed this recommendation and forwarded it for the consideration of Senate.

The motion that the composition of the Senate Committee on Undergraduate Studies be expanded to include the Registrar of Sir Wilfred Grenfell College or delegate as ex-officio member which was moved by Mr. Collins, seconded by Mr. Andrews, carried.

97. CONSTITUTION OF THE SCHOOL OF PHARMACY

A memorandum dated March 15, 2006 was received from the Academic Council of the School of Pharmacy proposing amendments to its Constitution.

It was moved by Dr. Hensman, seconded by Professor Andrews, and carried that the proposed amendments to the Constitution of the Academic Council of the School of Pharmacy be approved for submission to the Board of Regents.

98. <u>REMARKS FROM THE CHAIR - QUESTIONS/COMMENTS FROM SENATORS</u>

- Dr. Campbell noted that the Marine Institute has initiated a process to create a School of Ocean Technology. He emphasized that this is an item for information purposes only as it will take time to develop a full range of proposed programs.
- With regard to the Strategic Planning Process, Dr. Campbell reported that a number of external consultations have taken place which included visits to Labrador, Stephenville, Corner Brook, Windsor, Clarenville, Gander, St. John's and Harbour Grace. He noted that the views heard suggest that generally the University is doing well but much more needs to be done in rural parts of Newfoundland and Labrador. Dr. Campbell noted that the Working Group is in the process of summarizing the results of the consultations and will be drafting a report. Senate will be given an opportunity to review the draft report at a future meeting.
- Dr. Campbell provided a brief overview of the 2006-2007 provincial grant to the University and the potential impact that the significant increase in capital and operating funding might have on the University.

With regard to Dr. McKay's comment that the integrity of our academic decision making processes be maintained as approaches to conducting business are modernized, particularly via email, (e.g. Consent Agenda Item 3.B. and appropriate rules for e-mail voting), Dr. Campbell indicated that he would place this item on the agenda for a future meeting of the Academic Deans and Directors.
