#### 1. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

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## 3. UPDATE ON STRATEGIC RESEARCH PLAN – Dr. Bose

Dr. Bose reviewed the process that this draft document has undertaken and where it is now, in the process. He said that the document is currently with the working group for revisions and has not yet gone back out for a second round of feedback. It will come to SCOR as soon as it is ready and typically, would be endorsed by SCOR before going on to the Senate. ## 4. DISCUSSION ON VPR AND COMMUNICATIONS – Dr. Bose

The Chair spoke to a lack of communications from the VPR office to faculties and from within faculties to researchers during the Pandemic, which was raised at the last meeting, and asked Dr. Bose if he had looked into this and if there was a way to improve communications within the research units and across the board. Dr. Bose stated that communicating across the university is something he considered extremely important and said that he understands that no matter how much is done, there could always be more. He then went on to let the committee know what he has implemented since he has been at the university:

- Brown bag lunches with different departments and faculties
- Doing more through consultations; a good example of which is the Technology Transfer office which does multiple sessions across the University so that researchers can get input and information on things at various times
- Regular meetings with the Deans as well as visits to the campus (ie Grenfell and Labrador)

Dr. Bose also mentioned that since the pandemic the dissemination of information online has increased and was sent out rapidly over Newsline so as not to weigh down email.

## 5. UPDATE ON RESEARCH PORTAL – Mr. David Miller

Mr. Miller said that the vendor has encountered some significant challenges much of which is pandemic related. They are trying to expand their market substantially and rollout across Canada and other places and they have run out of programmer capacity. They are, at this point, unable to deliver the product that was promised a year ago. Mr. Miller said that we are looking at 2024 go live for Ethics. He said that Animal Care is looking like if will be the first to go live this year.

## 6. UPDATE ON TRICOUNCIL FUNDING AND TRENDS – Mr. David Miller

Mr. Miller stated that the University fared really well through Covid. Research numbers climbed steadily and the tri-agency numbers also climbed. He said that he just received some preliminary results and it is looking like a very small gain over last year as well. Mr. Miller said that we are up 46% from 2013 which is not bad as there is a limited pool for tricouncil money available and all universities are trying to get more out of it. He also said that the number of research funding applications has been declining since 2017 and seems to be back in the more normal range (around 1500 grant applications vs. 1700). Mr. Miller said that it is also important to remember that there are a lot of researches on campus who are not represented in the statistics from his office. A lot of people doing research and scholarly activity that do not need a lot of, or in some cases any, funding and therefore are not generating metrics through research services.
