

Per Course Instructor Teaching Opportunities – Spring 2024

Faculty of Humanities & Social Sciences; Department of Sociology

Subject to sufficient enrolment and budgetary restrictions, the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences may appoint several Per Course Instructors to teach courses in Sociology in the Spring 2024 semester. Letters of application, along with curriculum vitae, a teaching dossier and the names and contact information of three referees should be submitted to Dr. Rochelle Côté, Interim Head, Department of Sociology by **Friday, February 23**. All required information must be received before applications will be considered; applicants are responsible for ensuring that their application files are complete. A completed Master's Degree, in Sociology, is required, but a completed PhD in Sociology is preferred. Previous teaching experience at the post secondary level is required.

SOCI 1000 Introduction to Sociology (two sections online)

The Department of Sociology, Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences at Memorial University is seeking an instructor for Soci 1000, Introduction to Sociology. This course is an introduction to the concepts, principles, and topics of Sociology.

SOCI 2120 Technology and Society (one section online)

The Department of Sociology, Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences at Memorial University is seeking an instructor for Soci 2120, Technology and Society. This course examines the role of technology in society and society's role in shaping technology. Topics may include the emergence of modern technological society, the impact of new technologies on social organization and culture, and the institutionalization of science and the production of scientific knowledge. The course also explores the ideological functions of science and technology.

SOCI 3307 Sociology of Health (one section online)

The Department of Sociology, Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences at Memorial University is seeking an instructor for Soci 3307, Sociology of Health. This course is an introduction to the sociological study of health, illness, and health care.

All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply. However, priority will be given to Canadian citizens and permanent residents of Canada.
