Course Title: Adult Psychological Assessment

Course Schedule: Will be determined by the Training Committee, Student Wellness and Counselling Centre Doctoral Residency in Professional Psychology Program in consultation with the instructor.

Campus Location: St. John's Campus, In Person

Course Description: This course focuses on post-secondary student and adult psychometric assessment and diagnosis as part of the SWCC doctoral residency in professional psychology. Our residents will build on and further develop skills in clinical interviewing related to psychometric assessment, the administration and interpretation of assessment measures, providing feedback, and completion of comprehensive assessment reports. This course will consist of (1) a didactic component including lectures and group supervision, and (2) a practice component including supervision of residents conducting psychometric and cognitive assessments, interpretation of results, providing feedback, and completion of comprehensive assessment reports. This course includes consideration of standards, ethics, uses, and interpretations of selected measures from an evidence-based foundation and consideration of individual differences and diverse populations.

Qualifications: 1. Doctorate degree in Clinical Psychology or Counselling Psychology required (PhD or PsyD), 2. Evidence of registration as a Psychologist (R.Psych) in good standing with the NLPB required, 3. Experience in supervising and teaching psychology trainees, 4. Formal post-secondary supervision and mentorship of doctoral residents of professional psychology, including didactic teaching, supervision of cognitive assessments (including consultation of assessment measures, assessment process, differential diagnosis), and completion of comprehensive assessment reports and related paperwork., 5. Experience with cognitive assessments including: conducting neuropsychological/cognitive assessments; preparation of comprehensive assessment reports and treatment plans; provision of evidence-based psychological interventions and support; strong skills in assessment report writing, clinical case conceptualization, and effective communication.
