

# Opt-Outs

Students in the following circumstances would be eligible to opt-out of the U-Pass program (deadlines apply):

Circumstance	Documentation required
Students reside outside of the Metrobus service area (1 kilometer from a bus stop) and do not live in direct route of a U-Pass park and ride lot.	Proof of residence.
Students' academic program requires them to be away from campus for a total of 60 calendar days or more during the semester. Examples include, but are not limited to, study abroad, co-op work term, Marine Institute work term, internship, clinical placement or leave of absence.	Proof of enrollment, where applicable, or form signed by department or academic unit.
Students not registered for classes, studying, conducting research or using facilities on campus at any time during the semester.	Form signed by department or academic unit.
Students with a medical condition that prevents them from using Metrobus services (Metrobus or GoBus).	Form signed by physician.
Students change from full-time status prior to the semester U-Pass opt-out deadline.	Proof of enrollment.
Students enrolled in the Postgraduate Medical Education program.	Proof of enrollment.
Students that are unable to use a U-Pass due to exceptional circumstances.	Case-by-case exceptional circumstances will be reviewed for potential opt-out or subsidized funding.

Part-time students, exclusively online students and post-graduate doctoral students\* are not eligible for the U-Pass program and therefore, are not eligible to vote.

Please note that opt-outs are valid for one semester only and do not automatically carry over to future semesters.

Some examples of those who do not qualify for opt-outs include:

- They choose to drive, bike or walk to campus
- They live on or near campus

\* *Post-graduate doctoral students refers to post-doctoral students/fellows.*
