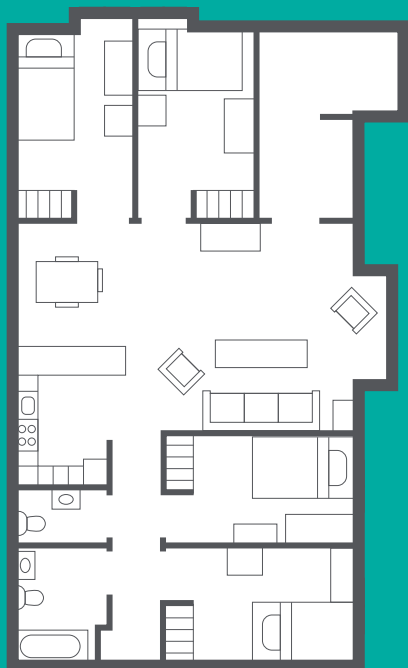

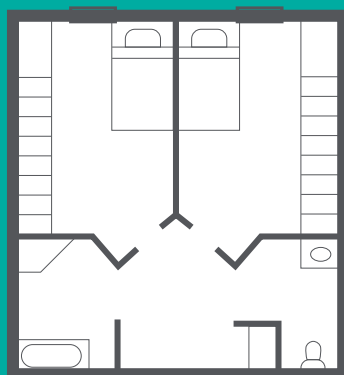
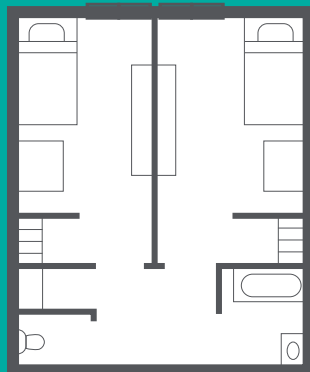

HOW TO APPLY

APPLY ONLINE

Apply now and indicate Grenfell Campus as your campus of choice.

The general undergraduate application includes:

- Grenfell undergraduate application for admission/readmission
- Non-refundable application fee (\$70 for Canadian citizens and permanent residents; \$300 for international students).

Review the specific admission requirements for your region and check the relevant deadline for filing your application.

SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS

Submit required supporting documents. Be sure to check and see if your program of choice requires any additional application materials/documents. When you submit your application, the admissions portal will allow you to upload select unofficial documents that may permit an early acceptance; however, to make a verified acceptance decision, you must submit official documents. Official documents are documents that need to be submitted from the issuing institution authority. They cannot be submitted through the admissions portal. Unless noted otherwise on our website, official documents must be sent from the institution's authorized document sending service or an institutional email address listed on the website of the issuing institution or authority.

If you are a current high school student from Newfoundland and Labrador, your final grades will be sent automatically. Otherwise, you will need to have your official transcripts sent to the admissions office.

If you are applying from a Canadian high school, you must complete the Grade 12 university preparatory program with a passing grade in each of the following subjects: English, mathematics, a laboratory science, a social science or modern or classical language, and an elective. You must have an overall average of 70 per cent within the Grade 12 subject areas noted above. If you are missing any of these requirements or have any questions, please contact the Registrar's Office at gcstudy@mun.ca. Some specific programs may have additional requirements.

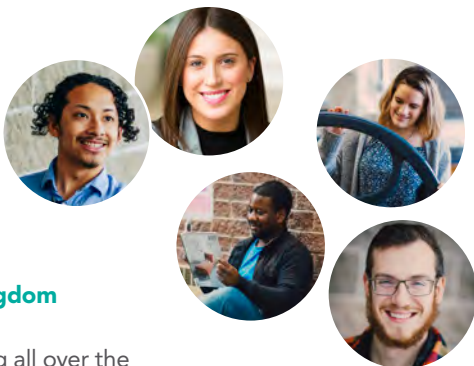
