BACHELOR OF COMMERCE

BACHELOR OF COMMERCE (CO-OPERATIVE)

NOTE: Students may complete joint degrees of bachelor of commerce and bachelor of music or bachelor of commerce (co-operative) and bachelor of arts.

AVAILABLE ELECTIVES | accounting, entrepreneurship, finance, general management, human resources management, information systems, international business, labour relations, marketing, supply chain and operations management

OPTIONAL MINORS FOR BUSINESS DEGREE PROGRAMS | choose a minor from the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, Faculty of Science, School of Music, or Marine Institute (safety management)

MINORS FOR NON-BUSINESS DEGREE PROGRAMS | business administration

EDUCATION

MINORS | choose a minor in anthropology, archaeology, classics, communication and media studies³, criminology³, economics, English, folklore, French, gender studies, geography, history, law and public policy, linguistics, medieval and early modern studies³, philosophy, political science, religion and culture, sociology, Spanish; or a minor from the Faculty of Business Administration, Faculty of Science, or School of Music

DIPLOMAS | creative writing; Northern peoples, lands, and resources; public policy; stage and screen technique

CERTIFICATES | criminology, film studies, geomatics and environment, history and philosophy of science and technology, Indigenous studies
