The Department of Anthropology, Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, Memorial University, is currently undertaking an open, internal search to recruit and nominate a candidate for a Tier 2 *Canada Research Chair in Indigenous Knowledge, Youth and Digital Technology*.

This competition is open only to applicants who:

- are current employees of Memorial University; and
- identify as members of one or more employment equity groups. As per approval granted by the Human Rights Commission pursuant to Section 8 of the Human Rights Act, these equity groups include women, 2SLGBTQIA+ people, Indigenous peoples, racialized persons, and persons with disabilities

Established in 2000, the [Canada Research Chairs \(CRC\) Program](#) offers eligible Canadian degree-granting institutions the opportunity to nominate a diverse cadre of outstanding researchers for professorships in areas that will further an institution's strategic research plan, enabling them to maximize their contributions as centres of research and research training. [Tier 2 CRCs](#) are appointed for a term of 5 years, at a value of \$100,000 per year, with an additional \$20,000 annual research stipend for first-term Tier 2 Chairs, and the possibility of a renewal term for an additional 5 years.

Tier 2 Chairs are intended for exceptional emerging scholars. Candidates must have been an active researcher in their field for fewer than 10 years at the time of nomination. Applicants who are more than 10 years from having earned their highest degree, and where career breaks exist, such as maternity, parental or extended sick leave, clinical training, etc., may have their eligibility for a Tier 2 Chair assessed through the CRC's [Tier 2 justification process](#). For this opportunity, appointments will be at the level of Assistant Professor or Associate Professor. Those at the level of Assistant Professor should have qualifications that will warrant promotion to the Associate Professor level within three years of the start of the Chair. The Chair's start date will be contingent upon the timing of the successful CRC application, and the salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience, in accordance with the Memorial University of Newfoundland Faculty Association (MUNFA) Collective Agreement.

### **Research**

The Tier 2 Canada Research Chair in Indigenous Knowledge, Youth and Digital Technology will focus on the transmission of Indigenous knowledge to youth by exploring how technological innovation can support self-determined and sustainable Indigenous futures. The Chair will be expected to collaborate with Indigenous communities to develop community-governed research on the use of technology to maintain and promote the continuity and resilience of intergenerational knowledge.

### **Qualifications**

The successful candidate will have:

- a PhD\* in Anthropology with a specialization in Socio-Cultural and/or Linguistic Anthropology;
- a track record of research and publications focused on Northern Canada and/or other Arctic and Sub-Arctic regions;
- a strong record of community-based, collaborative research with Indigenous groups relevant to the focus of the Chair;
- demonstrated experience of carrying out research that integrates Indigenous methodologies of relationality, reciprocity, and land-based knowledge.

The CRC competition involves a two-stage process as outlined below.

#### **Stage 1**

The application package must include the following information\*\*:

1. A cover letter outlining how the applicant's qualifications meet the criteria of the position.
2. A complete, up-to-date curriculum vitae.

3. A statement outlining the proposed area of research for the Chair (a maximum of two pages).
4. A statement of teaching philosophy, experience and interests, including plans for student mentorship and graduate student recruitment (a maximum of two pages).
5. The names and contact information of three individuals who can provide reference letters.
