



**Tier 2 Canada Research Chair in
Community Health and Substance Use Research**

The [Division of Population Health and Applied Health Sciences](#) (PHAHS), Faculty of Medicine, Memorial University, is currently undertaking an open, internal search to recruit and nominate a candidate for a Tier 2 *Canada Research Chair in Community Health and Substance Use Research*.

This competition is open only to applicants who:

- are current employees of Memorial University; and
- identify as members of one or more employment equity groups, including women; 2SLGBTQIA+ people; Indigenous peoples; racialized persons; and persons with disabilities as per approval granted by the Human Rights Commission pursuant to Section 8 of the Human Rights Act.

Established in 2000, the [Canada Research Chairs \(CRC\) Program](#) offers eligible Canadian degree-granting institutions the opportunity to nominate a diverse cadre of outstanding researchers for professorships in areas that will further an institution's strategic research plan, enabling them to maximize their contributions as centres of research and research training. [Tier 2 CRCs](#) are appointed for a term of 5 years, at a value of \$100,000 per year, with an additional \$20,000 annual research stipend for first-term Tier 2 Chairs, and the possibility of a renewal term for an additional 5 years.

Tier 2 Chairs are intended for exceptional emerging scholars (i.e., candidates must have been an active researcher in their field for fewer than 10 years at the time of nomination). Applicants who are more than 10 years from having earned their highest degree, and where career breaks exist, such as maternity, parental or extended sick leave, clinical training, etc., may have their eligibility for a Tier 2 Chair assessed through the CRC's [Tier 2 justification process](#). It is expected that the successful Tier 2 CRC will be appointed in a tenure-track position at the level of Assistant Professor. The Chair's start date will be contingent upon the timing of the successful CRC application, and the salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience, in accordance with the Memorial University of Newfoundland Faculty Association (MUNFA) Collective Agreement.

Research

The Division of Population Health and Applied Health Sciences (PHAHS) is part of the Memorial University's Faculty of Medicine. PHAHS is home to graduate programs in the fields of public health and public health nutrition, community health and clinical epidemiology, applied health services research, and bioethics. It contributes to the interdisciplinary occupational and health and safety graduate program, and leads the development and delivery of the community health, and bioethics and health law components of undergraduate and postgraduate medical education. PHAHS is home to Memorial University's [Centre for Bioethics](#) and the Faculty of Medicine's [Office of Social Accountability](#). It is partner to the [Newfoundland and Labrador Centre for Applied Health Research](#) (NLCAHR), and the [Human Neuroscience Research Centre](#).

The Tier 2 Chair will be expected to lead a nationally recognized, community-engaged research program focused on harm reduction, treatment interventions, and health equity for people who use drugs and other marginalized populations, including Indigenous communities and people experiencing homelessness.

Responsibilities of the Chair will include:

- Lead cross-disciplinary, community-based participatory research programs.
- Build research capacity to address substance use in small cities, rural, and remote contexts.
- Translate research into evidence-based policy and practice.
- Mentor graduate students and postdoctoral fellows in ethical, community-engaged research.
- Secure national research funding and develop multi-site collaborations.

Opportunities for the Chair will include:

- Collaborate with researchers and disciplines across the Memorial community and with NLCAHR.
- Partner with regional health authorities, community organizations, and national research teams.
- Help to establish Memorial University as a national leader in socially accountable and community-engaged substance use research.

Qualifications

The successful candidate will have:

- A demonstrated research record in community health, substance use, harm reduction, or related fields.
- A PhD* in Public or Population Health, Community Health or related field
- Experience with participatory research and working with underrepresented populations.
- Demonstrated potential to secure CIHR funding.
- Demonstrated commitment to mentorship, training and knowledge translation.

**This is a requirement of Memorial University, not the CRC Program.*

How to apply

The CRC competition involves a two-stage process as outlined below.

Stage 1

Applications must be emailed as a single PDF file, with the subject heading: “**CRC applicant_(YOUR NAME)**,” to the Associate Dean, Dr. Laurie Twells, phahs.assocdeanoffice@mun.ca. The application package must include the following information**:

1. Cover letter, highlighting the applicant’s qualifications.
2. Complete, up-to-date curriculum vitae, including information on the applicant’s HQP training.
3. Summary of the proposed research program (no more than five pages).
4. HQP training plan.
5. Equity, Diversity, Inclusion and Anti-Racism (EDI-AR) statement.
6. Names and contact details for three referees.

Stage 2

Working with the Division, Faculty and Memorials' [Research and Initiatives Services](#) (RIS), the successful candidate will complete the CRC application. Once completed, the application will be submitted to the CRC Program. Please note that nominees only become Chairholders once the submitted application has been successfully awarded by the CRC Program.
