In January *The Book Thief* surprised some members to learn it was considered a young adult book, set in the Nazi era and narrated by Death!

For February Jessica Grant was our guest author with her highly awarded first novel *Come, Thou Tortoise*. Both she and her book were delightful, and the evening was a pleasure for the 25 women attending. Our March selection is *The Help* by Kath-ryn Stockett and we are learning about a lawsuit against the author which adds a little extra spice to the mix. We look forward to having author Trudy Morgan Cole with us in April when we discuss her book, *By the Rivers of Brooklyn.* For May, we'll be discussing *Breakwater House* by Pascale Quivger, and in June we're planning our annual Potluck and Book Choosing Event at the Anglican Cathedral's Crypt. Certainly nominating and voting on next year's books, plus a lavish potluck makes it an exciting evening.

It's been a full year and most members say they have read books they never would have chosen if not for the Book Group, and then we remind ourselves that the selections were made democratically.
